VICTORIA

Victorian Hand Surgery Associates Fellowship

Two **clinical fellowships** in Hand Surgery are available for 12 month periods for surgeons who have successfully completed their surgical training and are interested in further training in Hand Surgery. One of these positions is available for applicants appointed to the PFET program in Hand Surgery administered by the Australian Hand Surgery Society.

The successful candidates will work with the surgeons of Victorian Hand Surgery Associates in private practice and with the Plastic and Hand Surgery Unit at St. Vincent's Public Hospital Melbourne.

The clinical fellowship involves experience in pre-operative, operative and post-operative management of a wide variety of hand conditions. This will include both elective and emergency conditions including microsurgical reconstruction and replantation. The fellows will also be encouraged to become involved in post-operative rehabilitation with involvement with the private and public hand therapy services.

The fellows will be involved in the day to day running of the hand service including undergraduate and post-graduate teaching, journal club, audit and other clinical meetings and ongoing clinical research. The fellows will also attend regular meetings of the Victorian Hand Surgery Society and will be expected to present papers at the annual scientific meeting of this society.

A stipend is available for successful candidates.

A 12 month **laboratory research fellowship** is also available. This involves research performed through the Hand and Wrist Biomechanics Laboratory at the O'Brien Institute / St. Vincent's Institute of Medical Research. This position is open to surgical trainees and post-fellowship applicants. Funding for this position will depend on successful grant applications.

Royal Childrens Hospital Plastic and Maxillofacial Surgery Department Paediatric Hand and Microsurgery Fellowship

A Fellowship in paediatric hand surgery and microsurgery is available for a 12 month period beginning July 1st, 2015, for surgeons who are seeking to specialize in paediatric hand and microsurgery.

Upper Limb Fellowship

This Fellowship is available through the practice of Perth Orthopaedics and Sports Medicine Centre of Mr. Peter Hales.

This is a 6 month Fellowship in hand and upper limb surgery with a bias towards arthroscopic surgery of the wrist, elbow and shoulder.

The break up of cases is probably about 50% hand and 50% elbow and shoulder.

The hand cases are mainly elective with a smattering of trauma but there is no microsurgery other than additional nerve repairs.

The bias of the hand and upper limb practice is very orthopaedic, rather than plastic. The spectrum of cases in the hand and wrist would run the whole gamut other than that which requires microsurgery.

Clinical Duties

The Fellowship offers the opportunity to gain surgical experience and instruction in the management of disorders of the hand and upper limb.

The candidate will have a Fellowship from the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons or have extensive clinical experience in orthopaedic surgery. Candidates from overseas will have qualification of equal standing.

The Fellow would perform clinical duties involved with the management of disorders

of the hand and upperlimb and would have a regular on call commitment at Modbury Public Hospital under the supervision of a hand surgeon. The Fellow would also assist the Hand and Upper Limb Surgeon in his private rooms and in private operating sessions, as well as attend regular academic meetings on disorders of the upper limb.

Research

The Fellow would be expected to perform clinical research throughout the twelve month attachment and would have specific time allocated for this. Research could be performed in conjunction with hand therapists.

Research protocols have been established and prospective data has been collected for future projects.
